<u>REPORT</u>

In the Narayana Engineering College, Nellore a seminar on "INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ELIMINATION OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN" was organized by women's forum of the ECE department on at Vishweshwaraya Auditorium, B-Block, NEC Nellore.

The objectives of this program are to create an awareness to the girl students how to face a challenging world with discrimination in the society towards women and to stop vigorous violence faced by girls and women

In this session Dr.Murali garu,HOD of ECE addressed the gathering and spoke few words about the violence to the gathering.Later discussed with the students about the theme behind the issues of violence faced by women

Violence occurs in about 35 per cent of women globally in their lifetime. In a study done in India, on about 10000 women, **26 per cent reported having** experienced physical violence from spouses during their lifetime. The prevalence could be as high as 45 per cent as indicated by data from Uttar Pradesh

Violence against women in India refers to physical or sexual violence committed against a woman, typically by a man. Common forms of violence against women in India include acts such as domestic abuse, sexual assault, and murder. In order to be considered violence against women, the act must be committed solely because the victim is female.

Violence against women in India is actually more present than it may appear at first glance, as many expressions of violence are not considered crimes, or may otherwise go unreported or undocumented due to certain Indian cultural values and beliefs.

According to the National Crime Records Bureau of India, reported incidents of crime against women increased 6.4% during 2012, and a crime against a woman is committed every three minutes According to the National Crime Records Bureau, in 2011, there were greater than 228,650 reported incidents of crime against women, while in 2015, there were over 300,000 reported incidents, a 44% increase. Of the women living in India, 7.5% live in West Bengal where 12.7% of the total reported crime against women occurs Andhra Pradesh is home to 7.3% of India's female population and accounts for 11.5% of the total reported crimes against women

65% of Indian men believe women should tolerate violence in order to keep the family together, and women sometimes deserve to be beaten. In January 2011, the International Men and Gender Equality Survey (IMAGES) Questionnaire reported that 24% of Indian men had committed sexual violence at some point

. Exact statistics on the extent case occurrences are very difficult to obtain, as a large number of cases go unreported. To combat violence and other abuses against women, Telangana Police have established SHE Teams to focus on the safety of women.
